Data collection within using NOMS / GPRA for adults and minors within Parkview Behavioral Health Assessment Clinic (formerly known as the Parkview Crisis Walk-In Clinic) as part of a SAMSA grant (FAIN# H79SM083043). Coordinated with clinical staff to ensure the physical and emotional well-being and safety of each patient. Maintained sensitivity and confidentiality while interacting a variety of vulnerable populations & clinical diagnoses (including individuals in substance abuse recovery, those prior/recent suicidal attempts, patients with bipolar or schizophrenia disorders, minors with complex traumas and behavioral disorders etc.) Communicated regularly with research & grant team to ensure the quality of data and deadlines of grant goals.
